INFORMS:

In accordance with what Cemex Colombia S.A. (Cemex Colombia), an indirect subsidiary of Cemex Latam Holdings S.A. (CLH), has been informing through the notes to the financial statements sent to the Finance Superintendence of Colombia (Superintendencia Financiera de Colombia), last submitted on July 28, 2017, regarding the investigation that began in September 2013 by the Superintendence of Industry and Trade (Superintendencia de Industria y Comercio) against 5 cement companies and 14 executives of those companies, including CEMEX Colombia and 2 of its former officials, due to alleged violations to the free competition system, this Company was notified of the detailed opinion document (informe motivado), issued by the Deputy Superintendent for Competition Protection in which, highlighting the most relevant aspects, he recommends sanctioning Cemex Colombia for alleged practices that restricted competition, in addition to other companies and natural persons. It should be noted that the detailed opinion document serves as a recommendation, closes the investigation stage, and does not imply the end of the process or a sentence to pay a sanction or fine at this time. This detailed opinion must be studied by the Superintendent of Industry and Trade, who shall decide through a detailed resolution whether or not to impose economic sanctions, according to the recommendations contained in the detailed opinion. Cemex Colombia has 20 business days to file observations to the detailed opinion. Additionally, once the relevant resolution is issued by the Superintendent of Industry and Trade, through which he will decide whether or not to impose sanctions, Cemex Colombia will be entitled to turn to the administrative procedure to file an appeal against said resolution, in case it is unfavorable. If the unfavorable decision is confirmed, Cemex Colombia will be entitled to turn to the administrative courts to file a lawsuit against that decision.
