COLOMBIA BOGOTA. MARCH 29, 2023. CEMEX LATAM HOLDINGS, S.A. ("CLH") (BVC: CLH) informs that today, the Fifth Criminal Court of the Bogota Specialized Circuit with Judgment Function ("Judge of Knowledge") issued a guilty verdict against Édgar Ramírez Martínez, former Vice President of Planning of CEMEX Colombia S.A. ("CEMEX Colombia"), imposing a principal sentence of 15 years and 1 month prison, a fine of more than 50,000 monthly legal minimum wages for the year 2016 and as accessory penalties the disqualification from the exercise of rights and public functions and the disqualification from the exercise for the career of administrator or legal representative for a term of 15 years and one month, for the crimes of aggravated unfair administration, as well as illicit enrichment of individuals and falsification of private document, as co-author, for the case related to the cement plant built by CEMEX Colombia in the municipality of Maceo, Antioquia ("Maceo Case"), as previously informed to the market on several occasions.

In the same sentence, the Trial Judge sentenced Eugenio Correa Díaz, former president of Cl Calizas y Minerales S.A., imposing a principal sentence of 21-year prison, a fine of 51,000 monthly legal minimum wages for the year 2016, and as accessory penalties, the disqualification for the exercise of rights and public functions and the disqualification for the exercise for the career of administrator or legal representative for a term of 20 years, as co-author, for the crimes of illicit enrichment of individuals, as well as falsification of private document and money laundering, related to the Maceo Case.

The aforementioned judicial decision is the result of the complaint filed in 2016 by CLH and CEMEX Colombia before the Office of the Attorney General of the Nation, as a consequence of the internal audits and investigations carried out by CLH and CEMEX Colombia, in compliance with their Corporate Governance policies and Code of Ethics, as previously informed to the market. CLH and CEMEX Colombia were recognized as victims and their representatives in the aforementioned process.

Against the sentence issued today, Edgar Ramírez Martínez and Eugenio Correa Díaz filed an appeal.
